

**Taylor Borough
Regular Monthly Meeting
July 12, 2023**

The Taylor Borough Council held its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, July 12, 2023, at 7:00 P.M. at the Taylor Municipal Building, 122 Union Street, Taylor, Pennsylvania.

President Mickavicz chaired the meeting.

On Roll Call: Councilman Nezlo, Yes; Councilman Maldonato, Yes; Councilman McKeel, Yes; Councilman Tigue, Yes; Councilman Digwood, Yes; Councilman DeAngelo, Yes; President Mickavicz, Yes; Mayor Kavulich Loiselle, Yes.

Next, President Mickavicz asked the public if they had any comment or input regarding the agenda items. There were none.

Next, President Mickavicz announced that the Taylor Police Department, along with the Mayor, Chief Holland would like to present Daniel P. Zeleniak, retired Borough Manager, with a plaque thanking him for all of his support and kindness to the Taylor Police Department throughout his years of service.

Next, the Mayor presented Dan with a proclamation on behalf of the Council, the Mayor and the entire Borough of Taylor, honoring his years of service to Taylor Borough. Mr. Zeleniak thanked everyone for their kind words.

Next, President Mickavicz stated that everyone had the opportunity to read and review the June 13, 2023, Rescheduled Meeting Minutes held at the Taylor Municipal Building at 122 Union Street, Taylor, Pa. President Mickavicz asked if there were any corrections, additions, or deletions. None noted. A motion to approve by Councilman McKeel and seconded by Councilman DeAngelo. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. The motion passed. The meeting minutes were approved as presented.

Next, Mr. Digwood asked to amend the Agenda to add the hiring of two employees to the Department of Public Works. This would require this meeting to be recessed and we will reconvene on Monday, July 17, 2023 at 5:30 P.M. President Mickavicz

entertained a motion to amend the Agenda and recess this meeting. A motion to accept was made by Councilman Digwood and seconded by Councilman Tigue. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. No one from the public had any questions or input. The motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to authorize the President of Council and any other Borough Officials to execute an agreement with Astound Broadband. A motion to accept by Councilman Maldonado and seconded by Councilman McKeel. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. The motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to adopt Resolution # 6 of 2023, authorizing the execution of all documents and agreements between the Taylor Borough and the Commonwealth Financing Authority to facilitate and assist in obtaining a Greenways, Trails and Recreation Program Grant on behalf of Riverside High School in the amount of \$212,100.00. A motion to adopt Resolution 6 was made by Councilman Digwood and seconded by Councilman McKeel. A roll call was made - Councilman Nezlo, Yes; Councilman Maldonado, Yes; Councilman McKeel, Yes; Councilman Tigue, Yes; Councilman Digwood, Yes; Councilman DeAngelo, Yes; President Mickavicz, Yes. The Resolution was adopted.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to adopt Resolution # 7 of 2023, to accept roads in Whispering Pines Subdivision. A motion to adopt Resolution 7 was made by Councilman Tigue and seconded by Councilman Maldonado. A roll call was made - Councilman Nezlo, Yes; Councilman Maldonado, Yes; Councilman McKeel, Yes; Councilman Tigue, Yes; Councilman Digwood, Yes; Councilman DeAngelo, Yes; President Mickavicz, Yes. The Resolution was adopted.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to approve CB Asphalt Solutions to sealcoat TCC Parking Lot in the amount of \$5,800.00. A motion was made by Councilman McKeel and seconded by Councilman DeAngelo. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. The motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to approve Bowen Enterprises to install a Manhole at Rosedale Drive and Schrader Street in the amount of \$5,200.00. A motion was made by Councilman Tigue and seconded by

Councilman McKeel. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. The motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to pay the June 2023 Payroll in the amount of \$157,606.96. June General Fund Open Invoices in the amount of \$151,929.48. June Paid Invoices in the amount of \$20,841.39 and June Liquid Fuels Open Invoices in the amount of \$6,650.43 - Total Expenditures \$337,028.26 when funds are available. A motion was made by Councilman Tigie and seconded by Councilman Digwood. A voice vote was called and all Council Members were in favor. The motion passed.

During the month of June 2023, the Police Department responded to 706 incidents.
