

**Taylor Borough  
Council Meeting Minutes  
September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025**

The Taylor Borough Council held its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 P.M. at the Taylor Municipal Building, 122 Union Street, Taylor, Pennsylvania.

President Mickavicz chaired the meeting.

President Mickavicz opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

At this time, President Mickavicz acknowledged the loss of William Nash and Tommy Reed and requested a moment of silence for them both.

Next, President Mickavicz asked if anyone from the Public had any comments or input on the agenda. There were none.

Next, President Mickavicz asked if everyone had the opportunity to read and review the Meeting minutes of the August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025 regular meeting. If there are no corrections, deletions or additions, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to accept the minutes. A motion to accept was made by Councilman Digwood and seconded by Councilman DeAngelo. A voice vote was called, and all Council Members were in favor and the minutes were accepted as presented.

For Old Business, President Mickavicz discussed working with DCED on working to secure funding and a possible location for a combined Public Safety Building. A brief conversation followed. President Mickavicz appointed a committee for this project. The committee members will be Councilman Nezlo, Councilman DeAngelo, and Councilman Maldonato along with the Police Chief, the Borough Fire Chief, and the Mayor.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to approve Resolution No. 14 of 2025 recognizing Taylor Fire & Rescue as the officially recognized Fire Company to provide fire protection and emergency services to the Borough. A motion was made by Councilman Maldonato and seconded by Councilman McKeel. A roll call was made by President Mickavicz: Councilman Fox, Yes; Councilman Maldonato, Yes; Councilman McKeel, Yes; Councilman Nezlo, Yes; Councilman Digwood, Yes; Councilman DeAngelo, Yes; President Mickavicz, Yes; Having received a unanimous vote, the motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to table advertising amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for Section § 180-29, Section § 180-34, and Section § 180-

28. A motion was made by Councilman Digwood and seconded by Councilman DeAngelo. A voice vote was called, and all Council Members were in favor.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to approve Resolution No. 15 of 2025 to apply for the LSA Grant – Monroe County for \$7,185 to place cameras in Noakes and Derenick Park. A motion was made by Councilman DeAngelo and seconded by Councilman Fox. A roll call was made by President Mickavicz: Councilman Fox, Yes; Councilman Maldonato, Yes; Councilman McKeel, Yes; Councilman Nezlo, Yes; Councilman Digwood, Yes; Councilman DeAngelo, Yes; President Mickavicz, Yes; Having received a unanimous vote, the motion passed.

Next, President Mickavicz entertained a motion to approve Resolution No. 16 of 2025 to apply for the LSA Grant – Monroe County for up to \$44,000 to resurface the Basketball and Tennis Courts in Derenick Park. A motion was made by Councilman DeAngelo and seconded by Councilman Maldonato. ### Mayor's Report

During the month of August 2025, the Police Department responded to 865 incidents. There were 27 traffic crashes investigated; 274 Traffic Stops were made; and 123 traffic citations were also issued 2 non-traffic citations. Officers made 19 criminal arrests. Arrest Report's — Officer Roche – 1 arrest; Officer Baizan – 1 arrest; Officer McDonald – 1 arrest; Officer Strenkoski – 1 arrest; Officer Boback – 2 arrests; Officer Palonis – 3 arrests; Sergeant Snyder – 3 arrests; Officer Graham – 3 arrests; Officer Moran – 4 arrests.

Revenues received for the month of August 2025: Quality of Life Fines - \$200; Judicial Fines - \$202.16; Magistrate Fines - \$6,366.94; Police Reports - \$420.00; Ransom, Twp. Payment 3 of 4: \$71,808; Total Revenue \$78,997.10.

Rich Shevlin, Rock Street – Questioned weather of not Rock Street would be paved this year. It was responded that Rock Street is part of the paving project for 2025.

Jeanie Sluck, for the Library – Stated there was a gas leak at the library today that is now resolved.
